Kristus Raja School is very different from schools in New Zealand. It was built in 1970 and is still standing 50 years later! Unfortunately many of the original desks and chairs are broken and need replacing.

At Kristus Raja School more than 90% of the students' families have always lived in West Papua. They have occupied and lived off the land for centuries over many generations.
